The wounds and scars impacting communities from historical injustice continue to fester with limited band aid approaches not getting to the root causes of the pain. These deep wounds have affected identity, self-confidence and a sense of wellbeing, exacerbated by ongoing injustice, violence and poverty. Communities informed by a history of colonial and postcolonial struggles, where weapons of words that undermined were as affective as weapons that inflicted physical violence. As Christians we follow the Prince of Peace and are called to a Ministry of Reconciliation. What does this look like in practice and how do we get there together? This consultation seeks to ask these questions and discern together the way ahead.
