Breeds of Horse 2 Activity 2

Can you match each breed & description to the picture?

Large horses, usually 16.1-17.2hh & weigh 900-1000kg. They are always chestnut in colouring. Generally shorter than Shires or Clydesdales but thicker set and have been developed for agricultural work rather than road haulage. The breed has a powerful arching neck, well muscled, sloping shoulders, a short wide back and a muscular, broad croup. Legs are short and strong with little to no feathering on the fetlocks.



The smallest of the Welsh Breeds. They are more refined than those in Section C and D. They are characterised from the cob types by a large eye, small head (often with a dished face from the Arabian influence), high set on tail, and refined leg conformation but retaining good bone and correctness. They may be any solid colour. They may not exceed 12hh in the United Kingdom or 12.2hh in the USA.



The maximum height allowed it 14.2 ¼ hh as per this breed's breed society. They should be of riding type, workmanlike and strong in conformation with a sloping shoulder and powerful hindquarters. The body should be deep and the legs straight with strong, flat bone, and hard rounded hooves. Larger ponies, although narrow enough in the barrel for children to ride comfortably, are also capable of carrying adults. They have free and even gaits, active and straight but not exaggerated, and is noted for surefootedness, agility and speed.





Typically 15.2-17hh. They are most often bay, dark bay/brown, chestnut, black or grey. The face and lower legs may be marked with white but white will generally not appear on the body. They have a well-chiselled head on a long neck, high withers, a deep chest, a short back, good depth of hindquarters, a lean body and long legs. They are classified among the 'hot blooded' breeds – animals bred for agility and speed, and are generally considered spirited and bold.
