hristians from all denominations, including Lifegate Outreach Centre and the general public across Walsall came together on Good Friday, 18 April 2025, for Easter procession and service at the Walsall Town Centre. This annual event, tagged Walking the Way of the Cross is a walk of witness in remembrance of Jesus's experience at crucifixion. It was a re-enaction of the story of the Jesus Christ of Nazareth carrying his cross with Roman guards surrounding him as he was being beaten with a crown of thorns on his head. This is a reminder of the death of Jesus Christ



on the Cross and the reason for the season.

The Holy Saturday, 19 April 2025, witnessed Lifegate in an outreach mission that lasted 7 hours and led by Dr. Mathias Akor. he Easter holiday and food programme (HAF) for children of ages 4-11 began on Monday 14 April 2025. On Tuesday 15 2025 the children went on a day trip to The Light Cinema, Walsall, and watched a movie titled Flow, a no-dialogue animated movie where a cat and other animals were seen to experience post-apocalyptic flood. It shows the development of the spirit of survival in the cat during tribulation. Cat, usually a lone animal, worked as a team member with other animals in this movie, not only for survival of individual animal, but to find a new place of abode them. The movie lay strong emphasis on teamwork regardless of individual differences.

The movie ended at 11.45am and children took the short walk back to activity venue, Lifegate Outreach Centre, from the Cinema, wearing reflective vests and accompanied by staff members who guided and guarded the children. Safeguarding is taken seriously at Lifegate, the Project Administrator, Elohor Irikefe, insisted on headcounts of children before and after the movie to ascertain the number of children who attended from the beginning were the same walking back.

It was four days filled with fun and activities which included food workshop, healthy food preparation, dodgeball, tug of war, bingo games, and other fun activities. Many of the children were delighted and expressed interest in engaging in more activities like this at Lifegate Outreach Centre in the future. The programme ended on Thursday 17 April 2025. Happy children make a happy community. Lifegate is grateful to be able to contribute to the positive growth of Walsall community.
