Requirements labeled as MUST are critical to the current delivery timebox in order for it to be a success. If even one MUST requiremen is not included, the project delivery should be considered a failure. MUST can also be considered an acronym for the Minimum Usable SubseT.

Requirements labeled as SHOULD are important but not necessary for delivery in the current delivery timebox. While SHOULD requirements can be as important as MUST, they are often not as time-critical or there may be another way to satisfy the requirement, so that it can be held back until a future delivery timebox.

Requirements labeled as COULD are desirable but not necessary, and could improve user experience or customer satisfaction for little development cost. These will typically be included if time and resources permit.

Requirements labeled as WON'T are not planned into

the schedule for the delivery timebox.
WON'T requirements are either dropped or reconsidered
for inclusion in later timeboxes.
