The Art World

What Constitutes Art?

Truth is, it is not an exact science. We are all free to express our opinion on an artist's work and so we should. Artists too must expect an honest appraisal of their creativity by admirers, critics and/or potential purchasers. Formal education teaches art with awards and honours and artists not trained in this way are often shunned by the establishment as somehow unworthy.

Jack Vettriano, the best selling artist in the UK remains outside of the establishment circles due to his lack of formal training. **Vettriano** is a good example, as the artist has been subject to much media ridicule when it was revealed he was using artist's figure reference books for his famous 'Singing Butler' images.

Vettriano need not concern himself with the views of art critics whilst selling more of his work than any other artist in the UK but it does set some critics firmly against the art collector or buyer of the artist's work. **Vettriano** originals sell for up to £1 million.

Formal Art Training

In past centuries formal art training would have students working alongside a master, learning all of his tricks and techniques. At some point the student was entrusted with the foundation painting in readiness for the master to arrive and apply finishing touches. The Art Studio method produced some of the greatest artists in history. French portraitist **Jean-Auguste-Dominique-Ingres** was the student to **Jacques Louis David** and went on to become one of the greatest portrait painters in history. ArtPrestige member **Leighton Charles** always refers to **Ingres** as the master of portraiture. Today we study the artists of past centuries albeit favouring impressionism to realism and the abstract modernity to past traditional styles. Since the nineteen sixties the art world and the art collector have embraced the abstract. Indeed...it is the love of abstract that has generated the question....

BUYING AFFORDABLE ART

by Hugh St Clair

Quote:

The argument still rages about what constitutes art. How often have you heard a comment such as 'My five-year-old grandson could have painted that!' in response to an abstract slosh of paint on a canvas?

Today, the art establishment accepts the notion that art can be an idea, a comment on today's world, and not, necessarily a rendition of say a religious scene, a recognisable landscape, or a portrait on a canvas.

Art critics and several commentators consider resistance to certain art to be rooted, in part, in the dual feeling that the spectator has to work too hard, or that the artist didn't work hard enough or long enough to create the piece. Even today some of us have great difficulty in understanding why a naively drawn bunch of flowers should be worth a lot more than a meticulously executed landscape. The flowers might well be sketchy, but maybe they have an atmosphere quality that the landscape lacks. Meticulous accuracy is no longer a criterion for judging a picture.

The art world today encompasses so many new creative strands that almost anything goes. For example it wasn't long ago that photography was accepted as an established art form worthy of exhibition space within major museums and conventional galleries. Digital photography takes the image and enhances it to a level that distorts the truth of the photograph but creates yet another new art form.

These art schools and movements are forever irresistible. However we must avoid getting too precious about a particular movement. Even Dante Rossetti got fed up with the art school that he invented, and is still celebrated today, of the *PreRaphaelite Brotherhood*. He became self-conscious about it, finally abandoning the idea feeling it rather silly. We love to put labels on things to help explain or simplify the detail. It is true that when we mention any of the art schools listed above we immediately think of practitioners and/or particular pictures.

For example mention of *Pop Art* might make the reader think of the artist *Roy Lichtenstein*. The Art World loves its movements because it helps classify a work, as if it is explained away by its very identification as belonging to a defined style or purpose. The identification of a school or movement somehow suggests that the work deserves merit simply because it is part of that identified movement. Being attributed to an art movement helps assess the artist's work in the context of personal objectives and beliefs.

THE ART WORLD CONTEMPORARY VERSUS *modern*

Quote:

BUYING AFFORDABLE ART

Contemporary broadly means work by living artists, even if they are now very old. Christie's Auctioneers reorganised their Contemporary Art Department in 2000, and now they distinguish between international artists from Post-Second World War years to the end of the 1960s, which come under the Post War category and then Contemporary Art, which is strictly applied to work produced in the 1970s or later.

While 'contemporary' has a relative, temporal meaning, 'Modern Art', on the other hand, tends to be characterised by a rejection of old subjects. In particular, the term usually refers to art created from a period dating roughly from the 1860s to the 1970s. For example, by the end of the 19th century the church and religious foundations were no longer important patrons of the arts.

BUYING FOR PLEASURE *or investment*

Art Collectors buying art, as with antiques, begs the question of buying simply for pleasure or investment. Obviously we naturally want our purchase to increase in value over time and be a prudent investment but is that the over-riding motive for buying or did we simply fall in love with the work with more altruistic reasons? Or perhaps it is a combination of the two?

Art Collectors may be influenced to purchase simply by the subject of the art. Art Collectors should buy their art for whatever reason and it is not for the Art World to dictate the actual value hierarchy, although they really do. The Art World dictates art values based on the market place history of known sales. Of course it is in their interest to create perceived values as if an exact science, which art, being subjective, can never really be. Art Collectors please note.

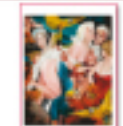

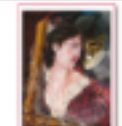

Signatures and Certificates

...of Authenticity

Art Collectors naturally look for honest assurance that the painting or picture being bought is genuinely as described by the seller. As with any purchase, in whatever walk of life, caution is always recommended. Buying from reputable dealers might be one way of avoiding disappointment and yet who can resist the first glance at what appears to be a bargain even when minus guarantees? In some cases bargains have indeed been secured from risk purchase based on instinct rather than guarantee.

ArtPrestige Certificates

A formal certificate of authenticity is not necessarily required to prove that a work of art is genuine. Any valid receipt, bill of sale, or proof of purchase from an artist or recognised authority will do.

ArtPrestige original paintings signed by the artist are sold with the signature on the painting - sometimes on the reverse - and supported by a Certificate of Authenticity (COA). The certificate is there to help not hype. It details the kind of information that buyers are most interested in. It is also a certificate that could be affixed to the rear of the picture particularly by a framer.

What Pictures have Certificates?

The ArtPrestige Certificates of Authenticity are issued for Original Painted works, AP Giclée Prints, AP Limited Edition Prints and AP Selected Prints only. We do not issue COA for ACEO cards and/or artist minor artworks we determine are not necessary.

Artist's Signatures

Most artists sign their work on the front of the painting usually to a bottom left or right corner...but not always. Some pictures are unsigned. Others are signed on the back of the painting. We have to understand that artists are unpredictable and their work is sometimes also produced under unusual circumstances.

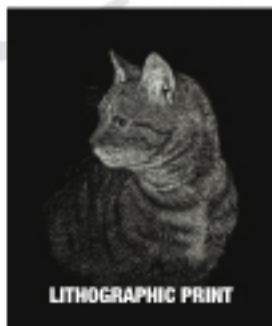

Giclée Prints

The word Giclée is derived from the French 'le gicleur.' A relatively new process in which the fine art prints are made from a digital source using ink technology. The result is a rich vivid image using inks light-fast for over seventy-five years. Each print is meticulously made to order from a high-resolution image of the original.

Picture Colour Variations

During the lifetime of any painting there are lots of variations at work upon that picture that can alter the viewing pleasure. For example it will look different in daylight than artificial light. Viewing can be affected by the painting being lit by picture lights, it may have acquired a film of dust, if in a smoking environment it will be coated in brown staining and the original could develop cracks and lines over years. We know the dramatic differences achieved when the pictures are sent for professional cleaning. In addition if positioned in direct sunlight the colours will fade over time.

Colour Variations - Screens and Printing

You can see a favourite painting represented in various books and magazines, or on television, and compare the colourings. In almost every case the paintings' colour will differ. Printing will vary dependent on the surface it is printed on and the type of printing, as witnessed by art magazines from the first half of the twentieth century using photogravure and/or lithographic processes compared to today's digital printing. It is extraordinary how subtle colouring can so vary. Add to this the light-fastness or lack of it by the inks used in the printing process and you have yet another variation. What this means is important. We have to be mindful that a picture will vary in colour dependent on the viewing circumstances be that print or screen. We are viewing artwork in varied mediums and not a true comparison by siting variations together. It is clearly quite ridiculous to over-interpret the colouring subtlety of a printed picture when we do not have the original alongside to compare and therefore know the artist's actual intention.

How will my print be sent to me? Giclée prints are sent within a protective tube or flat in a sturdy reinforced flat card pack for you to present to your framer for fitting mountboard and/or frame.

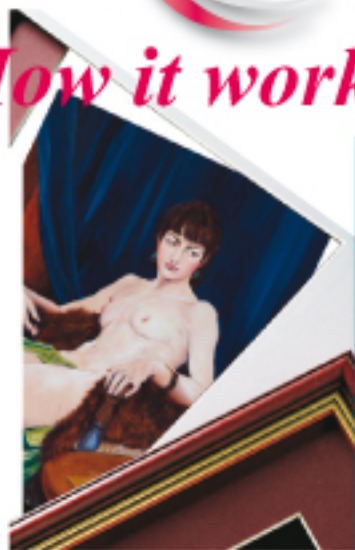

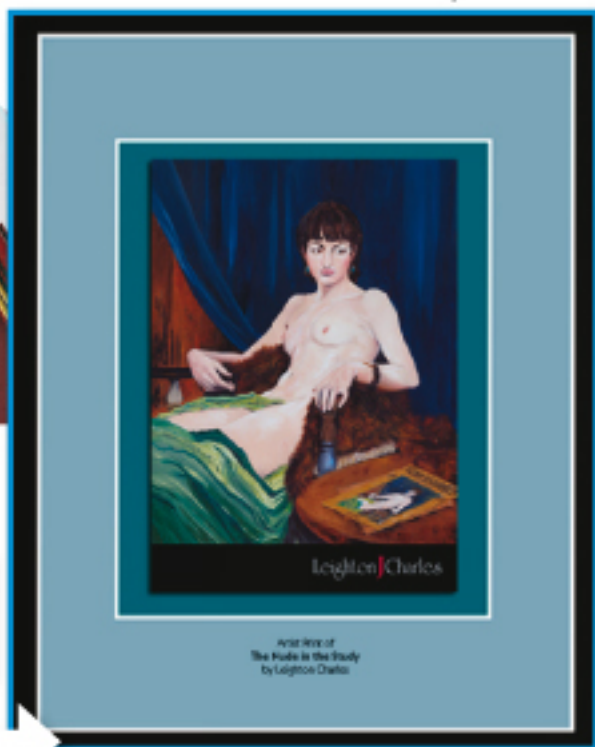

ACEO Artist's Trading Cards

Great way to collect Affordable Art!

Artist trading cards (or ATCs) are miniature works of art about the same size as modern trading cards or business cards with a standard size of **2 1/2 by 3 1/2 inches (64 mm x 89 mm)** small enough to fit inside card-collector albums with pockets, sleeves or sheets.

The ATC movement developed out of the mail art movement and has its origins in Switzerland. These Art Cards are produced in various media, including dry media (pencils, pens, markers, etc.), wet media (watercolor, acrylic paints, etc.), paper media (in an art form of collage, papercuts, found objects, etc.) or even metals or fibre. The cards are traded or exchanged. When sold, they are usually referred to as Art Card Editions and Originals (ACEOs).

The ACEO History

M. Vandi Stimmann credited with popularising the modern artist trading card in 1996 holding live trading sessions in Zurich, Switzerland. This resurgence of interest in the cards spawned the ACEO (Art Cards, Editions and Originals) movement.

Michael Leavitt's Art Cards, hand-painted small portraits of artists, replicated baseball trading cards in style and the format. Subjects were drawn from various genres, including artists like Vincent van Gogh, Bob Ross, Jackson Pollock, and Michael Jackson. Limited editions were hand-packed in wrappers with bubble gum. An earlier example, in 1991, Cleury Champion first sold his cards through the catalogue of *Experiment*, avant-garde magazine. Cleury Champion's most recognized cards were playing cards & experimental poems of John M. Bennett rubber stamped on the face.

Artist cards are a great way to collect Affordable Art.

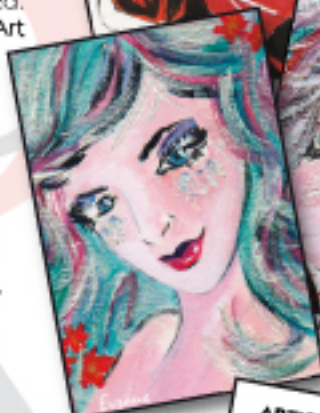
Artist trading cards, or ATCs, began in the tradition of business cards, but with a personal, artistic twist. Most ATCs are created on paper, but they may also be any other medium that can be worked in a suitable size. ATCs are traditionally the size of baseball cards and other trading cards. A fun way to exchange your own one-of-a-kind artistic flair with other artists you meet. You can also use them as business cards.

An offshoot of artist trading cards are Art Cards, Editions and Originals (ACEO), which originated when some artists began to create cards to sell, in addition to trading among themselves. Many ACEOs are sold on internet auction sites, such as eBay. As stated ACEOs may be small yet original works of art, or editions of small prints.

The interest in **Artist's Trading Cards** has developed to include an array of different sizes now being available. The origins of this format are steeped in the 2.5 x 3.5 size but today we find almost anything goes and can be described as Artist's Cards. The Artist's *Philosophy*

Portraiture

I love portraiture and finding the very best image, most realistic, most appropriate and rewarding of the subject. I think with portraiture I am looking for two things:

A likeness so real that you believe the person is actually there and the most interesting and memorable portrayal of the subject.

Realism

I believe in painterly realism and regard the capturing of a realistic likeness the most challenging task for any artist. I adore portraiture throughout the history of art. For me it is today as it was centuries ago, the ultimate test of artistry. I want that portrait so real that you'll believe the person to be alive in front of you. I admire painters from earlier periods that rendered the most difficult subjects and textures in this way. My favourites.....

Jean Auguste Dominique Ingres 1780 - 1867 - Harrington Mann 1864 - 1937 - George Spencer Watson 1869 - 1934 - Ambrose McEvoy 1878 - 1927 - Sir Oswald Birley 1880 - 1952 - and a hero, Sir Herbert James Gunn 1893 - 1964.

Characteristics

Everyone has a certain look that we know as dominant, it is often how we think of them. We know the person in this way and it is what I describe as their look. Some people talk of seeing someone's personality in people's eyes or character in a stare or demeanour. Obviously all of these features become relevant in the construction and composition of a portrait painting and we need to assess all features to find the definitive look.

Painterly Magic

If we accept that a realistic likeness is achievable is that enough? Maybe we want to introduce a little bit of magic that tells us more about the person? For example it could be a prop that is associated with the subject because of a hobby, a belief, an achievement or their career history. I do believe that artists appraise the world differently from most and that it is possible that we can suggest an image from identification of characteristics not easily seen by others. For example in the case of one particularly glamorous lady's portrait, a more interesting picture was a serious study reflecting the struggle of coping with a troubled life. It was the same glamorous lady but with a much stronger statement being made to quite wondrous effect. I adore the whole process of finding the very best image of a sitter. For me the portrait artist is the true master.

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Leighton J Charles

Firstly we have a customer that requires a portrait painting and has an idea of the picture that they are hoping for. It may be that a particular display position is already anticipated / prepared and thus the size of the finished picture is pre-determined.

Preparation Meeting

A planning meeting makes eminent sense for all participants. The first question is usually will we be working from life or photography? Working from existing photographic reference is popular today subject to the quality of that photograph. If it is impossible to work from the reference material then a new photograph would be required. If we are working from life is it realistic for the subject to travel to a studio or is the artist expected to work outside of his studio? Do we arrange a photographic study or is there already a photograph of the subject that a client wishes to use? What sort of portrait does the customer envisage?

The usual questions are: Is the mood to be formal or informal, dress smart casual, stately, relaxed, active, stationary, thematic, imaginary etc. What is the clothing to be worn by the subject? What will the background be and where will the painting eventually be displayed or hang?

The Function of the Portrait

The purpose of the portrait might be a special gift, a family member portrait, a business portrait, an Official State Portrait, a memorial portrait or a celebratory occasion or tribute celebrity picture. This might affect the timing and/or work schedule.

The Size of the Portrait - Favourite portrait size is life-size or near life-size.

Head and shoulders - (Possibly 24 x 20 inches)

Large Head and Shoulders, upper torso - may include hands - (Possibly 30 x 24 inches)

Head, shoulders down to waist - (Possibly 30 x 24 inches)

Including hands (basic three-quarter length) - (Possibly 36 x 30 inches)

Larger three-quarter length - (Possibly 40 x 32 inches)

Full Length - (Possibly 90 x 46 inches)

Almost all adult human head sizes fall somewhere between 8 and 10 inches (20 - 25cm) and the artist **John Singer Sargent** had a rather general rule that head size should be 'The size shown by the calipers minus half an inch.' In an official portrait however the head size may be as large as 10 inches (25cm) to suggest heroic qualities. These are traditional standards, of course and always the customer can determine the portrait and canvas size.

Practicalities

Dependent on the size and complication of the portrait will be the time it takes to produce a finished painting. A complicated background will add much studio work to the overall time. In view of the many variations of each portrait an estimate is prepared based on the agreed criteria. Any changes to the original agreement may then trigger a re-assessment of estimate. There are so many variables to a portrait painting but we endeavour to be exact in our quotations so that all parties know where they stand. **Studio work can be charged out by the hour so an estimate of the hours-required to fulfill the chosen criteria should provide a fairly accurate quotation.** Additional expenses might accrue if the artist is to travel to locations for planning meetings, preliminary sketches, actual painting etc. All portraits are subject to a 40% deposit being paid following initial agreement before commencement of the work.

Customer Satisfaction by Stage Development

Portraiture is commissioned on a simple stage development basis in which the customer approves and signs off each stage of the process making sure that client satisfaction is paramount. Also ensuring that all portrait customers remain in the loop from start to finish.

Stage Two - Preliminaries

The Artist creates the photographic reference if required and originates draft sketches and drawings from the agreed planning meeting. A working drawing and portrait is proposed for the customer's consideration. Customer agrees the draft portrait and artist quotation. Final considerations include copyright issues, publicity and ownership of reproduction rights etc. Customer pays a 40% deposit and signs off the second stage development.

Stage Three - Artist Begins the Real Portrait Canvas

The underpainting composition with tonal considerations is commenced. Layers of construction are underway creating a stage three finish for purposes of agreement. Customer has opportunity for late amendments and subtle changes. Once agreed the customer approves the third stage draft for completion to finished portrait.

The quotation does not include expenses chargeable which may incur (such as travelling to locations, accommodation (if necessary), additional research and/or new photographic reference materials) all of which must be identified by the artist before commencement of work and must be agreed with the customer. The artist will endeavour to fulfill the exact customer's requirements as identified per the initial stage planning agreements and set down in the provided Preliminary Draft.

The Preliminary Draft is the blue-print upon which the portrait is painted to a finished standard.

Much of the information here has been adapted from information found on the official website of the U.S. Copyright Office. Copyright is a form of protection provided by the laws of the United States (Title 17, U.S. Code) to the creators of "original works of authorship," including literary, dramatic, musical, artistic, and certain other intellectual works. This protection is available for both published and unpublished works. **Section 106 of the 1976 Copyright Act** generally gives the owner of copyright the exclusive right to do and to authorize others to do the following:

- To reproduce the work in copies or phonorecords;
- To prepare derivative works based upon the work;
- To distribute copies of the work to the public by sale or other transfer of ownership, or by rental, lease, or lending;
- To perform the work publicly, in the case of literary, musical, dramatic, and choreographic works, pantomimes, motion pictures and other audiovisual works;
- To display the copyrighted work publicly, in the case of literary, musical, dramatic, and choreographic works, pantomimes, and pictorial, graphic, or sculptural works, including the individual images of a motion picture or other audiovisual work; and
- In the case of sound recordings, to perform the work publicly by means of a digital audio transmission.

In addition to copyright, certain authors of works of visual art also have the rights of **attribution and integrity** as described in **Section 106A of the 1976 Copyright Act**.

It is illegal for anyone to violate any of the rights provided by the copyright law to the copyright holder.

Who Owns Copyrights? Copyright protection subsists from the time the work is created in fixed, tangible form.

The copyright in the work of authorship immediately becomes the property of the author who created the work. Only the author or those deriving their rights through the author can rightfully claim copyright. The ownership of a book, manuscript, painting, or any other work does not give the possessor of that work its copyright. The law provides that transfer of ownership of any material object that embodies a protected work does not of itself convey the copyright or any interest in the copyright. This remains in the possession of the creator and is often referred to as the **underlying artist's copyright**, distinct from the physical object which embodies it. Any or all of the copyright owner's exclusive rights or any subdivision of those rights may be transferred to another party, but the transfer of exclusive rights is not valid unless that transfer is in writing and signed by the owner of the copyright or such owner's duly authorized agent. Such transfers are comparatively rare in the U.S. and are almost never knowingly engaged in by European artists.

ArtPrestige Writers and Artists, Portraiture and the Laws of Copyright. What is Copyright?

A bundle of intangible rights, granted by statute to the **author or originator** of literary or an artistic production, whereby, for a limited period, the **exclusive privilege** is given to that person (or to any party to whom he or she transfers ownership) to make copies of the same for publication and sale. A copyright is a legal device that gives the creator of a literary, artistic, musical, or other creative work the sole right to publish and sell that work. All Copyright owners have (by law) the right to control the reproduction of their work, including the right to receive payment for that reproduction. An author may grant or sell those rights to others, including publishers or recording companies. Violation of any copyright is called **infringement**. Copyright must always remain with the author or artist that created the original work of art.

In the case of **portraiture** the copyright must still remain with the artist. In practical terms this merely safeguards the artist 'right' to reproduce the image in print or digital form for the purposes of further advertising or promotion of his services. Portraits are mostly highly personal images and therefore the reproduction value is limited; however there may be occasions where portrait images (particularly themed settings) are required for book illustrations, displays or reproductions - particularly in the case of famous artists. In each and every case the **copyright must remain with the artist** originating the portraiture artwork.

This protection need not concern customers and clients for portraiture.

The laws of copyright apply to every creative process by artists and artisans worldwide and have done since 1710. It is essential in these mass-media multi-communication times that the individual artist is protected from the exploitation of their creative originality.

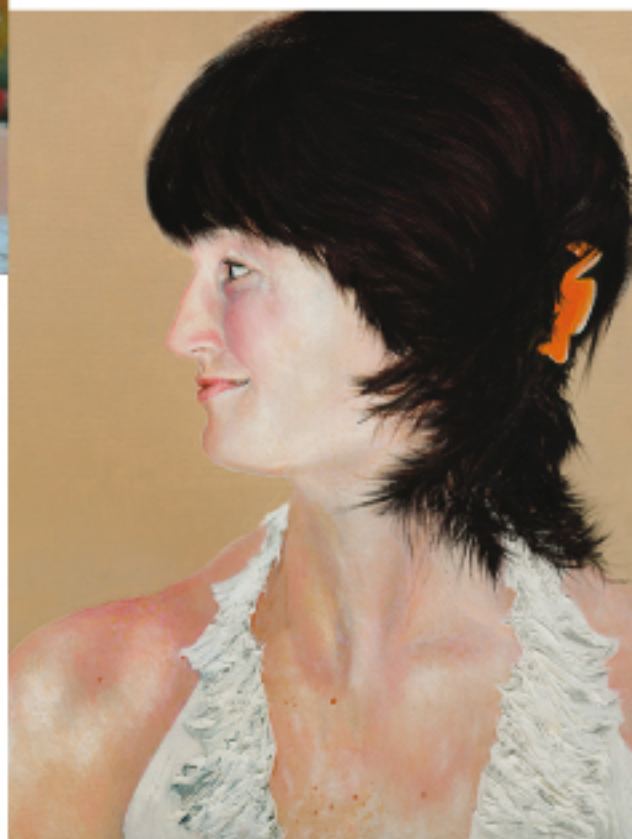
