


To all who have helped the club with donations, gifts, prizes and to all who have taken advertizing space in the brochure, as well as many more that are too numerous to name, thank you all very much.

A Dream Come True

After my appointment as Secretary, it became clear that the Younger members of the club wanted to improve the playing - field and facilities at 'New Road' Porchfield, unfortunately circumstances could not allow this to happen.

It was then a case of back to the drawing board, meetings were held, and it was unanimously agreed to search for another ground. Many hours were spent by the Treasurer Mr. Mike Cox, and myself, scouring Porchfield and approaching farmers to see if they had any land for sale. We finally came across two fields owned by Mr. Chris Clifford of Rodge Brook Farm available for purchase.

Having surveyed the two fields it was decided that the bigger field of approximately 6 1/2 acres (asking price £8,000) was just what we were looking for, provided Mr. Clifford could arrange an access point through to the Main Road. The problem then arose how could we raise £8,000. Club members were called together and approached about possible long term loans to get the project off the ground, amazingly the sum of £1,600 was pledged. With this backing, letters were written, application forms sought from Local Councils and the Southern Sports Council to apply for grants and loans. This proved very successful, with a total of £5,100 being offered in Grants and £1,200 in Interest Free Loans. With the aid of the Fund Raising Committee our target was achieved and the purchase of the field finally took place in June 1985.

Our first priority was then to construct a road from the New Ground into Colemans Lane, we were fortunate in having a Club Member Mr. Jim Caws, who owned a digger. Large quantities of soil were removed in preparation to receive many loads of hard-core, also during this construction a water supply was laid and connected to the mains. With the road completed our next task was to cut back the hedges, to give ourselves maximum playing area. We could now establish exactly where the Cricket Square would be sited. Having set out the Square we then sought the advice of Mr. Sandy Moral (who sadly passed away in 1986). He gave us some very useful tips, and suggested the laying of a land drain around the perimeter of the Square and channeling the water away to the brook. Preparation has continued up to the present day, plus continuous rolling and cutting of the Outfield.

Spurred on by our success and fund raising in full swing, our next target was to build a Pavilion. Plans were drawn up and passed, further grants were applied for, towards the estimated material cost of £11,500. An offer of £4,000 came from the Southern Sports Council plus £1,000 from TVS Trust.

As a bricklayer by trade I agreed, with the assistance of Mr. Ray Hayward also a building worker, to construct the Pavilion in our spare time, together with other volunteers. With many an hour worked during winter months and many under artificial light, our objective has been fulfilled.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all those who helped make this possible.

History of Porchfield Cricket Club

Unfortunately the origins of the club are lost in the mists of time, but there was at one time an old score book in existence for 1893 so that we know the club was in being in the last century. During the years before the 1914 war, games were played regularly each summer against such teams as Westover, Shallfleet, Newport Trades and Totland.

The members of the club were mostly locals, including farmers, whose horse drawn transport was used to take the team to away matches, also two doctors from Cowes, Drs. Hudson and Gibson. The cricket pitch was at that time in a field at the Homestead, Porchfield and one of the star bowlers was a Mr. J. Hayward, the name seems familiar, who was fast and a bit wild. It was said that he always had a bottle of beer hidden in the long grass at the beginning of his run to sustain his efforts.

Sometime just before the Great War the club must have changed to the New Road field, because at the end of the War, as a very small boy, I can remember the pavilion standing derelict about 200 yards further up the hedge from its present position. On 30th July 1919 as part of the Peace Celebrations, a match was played against Calbourne at Swainston Manor which Porchfield managed to win by 58 runs to 27. At about that time 2 or 3 members created the late pitch by digging it all over with garden forks, and from then on it was usual for the Council steam roller to take a few turns up and down each summer to keep it in condition.

In those days 'Farmer' Hawkins, who lived across the road from the entrance to the field, had a standing offer of £1 to anyone who could smash his window, but I don't think it was ever claimed, although I remember various shots going over the road, especially from Jack Coombes and Phil Fallick.

Between the Wars the club thrived, although more and more members came from outside the village, especially from Newport. Harold Barber of Newport fame, started his club career with Porchfield although he was soon taken away by Newport.

Cricket lapsed again during the Second World War, but in about 1947, after a year of cricket in ordinary farm fields, the pitch was brought back into condition and has been in use until 1986.

For the last one hundred years cricket has been part of the village scene in Porchfield and during that time a tremendous number of people have enjoyed their games in the simple rural surroundings and a very friendly but competitive atmosphere. Now a new beginning, and may I wish you very best of luck for the future.

Touring with Porchfield Cricket Club 1983 – 1986

May 1983 saw the start of touring for Porchfield Cricket Club. The week - end got off to a poor start with the weather forecast predicting rain, and so it did, all the way to Nottingham. The first ever tour match against Weston - mere School Staff began with a fine drizzle to accompany it. Porchfield batted first on a very wet pitch and managed to accumulate 107 - 9 with M. Cox (51) and S. Willis (24). As the conditions deteriorated, the School side could only manage 74 - 8 with R. Hayward taking 3 - 11 (and D. Andrew 3 - 20).

Socializing at the "Chequers" Saturday evening could only have had a detrimental effect on Porchfield's playing ability on the Sunday against Bramcote. Porchfield batted first and were very quickly despatched for a meagre total of 68. Bramcote won, making 71 - 6 with Ray Hayward taking 4 - 38 for the disappointed touring side.

Hopes were raised though on Monday morning when the sun came out, could the change in weather mean a change in fortune? Alas it was not to be. Long Eaton Olympians batted first, and accrued a total of 164 - 6. Porchfield obviously still not recovered from 3 nights of boozing, went out and had a disastrous time with the bat, being all out for 68 again.

In 1984 the club decided to change the tour. Itinerary and go to Stratford to play a game before going on to Nottingham.

Bearley C.C. who were in the process of developing their own new ground, put Porchfield in to bat. Could the Club improve their batting performances on tour, unfortunately the answer was NO! Porchfield being all out for a measly 64 with R. Hayward making an important 21 runs. Bearley, having struggled, due to some fine bowling by R. Hayward (2 - 9) eventually won the match with a total 65 - 8.

Sunday proved to be a disappointing day for the Touring Side. Having to call off its match against the Nottingham side of Bramcote due to a water - logged pitch.

After heavy drinking sessions, the night before, with the Bramcote lads, it was a surprise that anyone turned up for the Weston - mere game on Monday Afternoon. Again the weather played a part with drizzle falling throughout the match, Porchfield batted first and accumulated a total of 164 - 4 with M. Black (50) and S. Willis (50 n.o.) the main contributors. Weston - mere, although loosing steady wickets managed to hang on for a draw making 132 - 9, D. Andrew taking 3 - 35 and M. Andrew 3 - 20.

The 1985 tour saw another change in itinerary and a shortening of the week - end by a day returning home late Monday evening.

In the previous year the side felt as though it could have done better against Bearley of Stratford, and had high hopes of winning the fixture. Unfortunately Bearley did not know this and skittled out the team for 41. Bearley's secret weapon being D. Escombe with figures of 7 - 30. Bearley romped home to 9 wicket win in what was undoubtedly Porchfield's worst performance all year.


Sunday saw the Tour party motor up to Nottingham to play the now annual fixture against Bramcote. Typically the weather was yet again unkind and Bramcote declared at 120 - 7 on a very temperamental wicket. Conditions had eased quite considerably when Porchfield went out to bat but it was Andy Long's decisive batting display making 92 n.o. that won the day for the touring side who made 124 - 1. Porchfield had recorded their first ever win on tour.

The touring side's third match was to take place in Verwood, Porchfield elected to bat and proceeded to reach 177 - 6 K. Hayward (103 n.o.) and M. Cox (28). In a seemingly strong position Porchfield let the game slip away from them, with Verwood making 180 - 5 to win the game.

For the first time since Porchfield had been on tour the 1986 weather forecast was favourable and conditions at Stratford and Bearley were good. Porchfield batted first and reached 151 - 6 before tea with D. Wren (73 n.o.) and G. Holder (44). With some fine bowling, D. Andrew (3 - 18) and R. Hayward (2 - 3) and superb fielding, the touring side cruised to a convincing win, bowling Bearley out for 65.

Again the weather was fine at Bramcote with Porchfield batting first, A. Long was top scorer with 76 out of the side's total of 161 - 8, G. Holder (22). Bramcote, who at one stage were 89 - 2 and looking likely to win the match, slumped to 129 - 9, the match resulting in a draw.

Monday saw the team play Eastnor. Eastnor batted first and managed 124, all out, M.T. Andrew taking 4 - 40. Porchfield soon took control of the match with D. Wren (82 n.o.) and A. Long (22) steering the touring side home with a comfortable winning score of 128 - 4 1986 proved to be Porchfield's most successful tour to date.




