REED ENSEMBLE

Sarabande - Handel

This piece was originally from the 4th movement of Handel's Keyboard Suite in D minor and it was composed for a solo harpsichord in 1703.

It is a slow and stately piece in triple time with an emphasis on the second beat of the bar.

The Medallion Calls

This piece is from the 2003 film Pirates of the Caribbean, The Curse of the Black Pearl. It is used to introduce the character Jack Sparrow. It is then used throughout the film series as his signature tune.

Rocking Around the Christmas Tree

This famous Christmas song was written by Johnny Marks and recorded by Brenda Lee in 1958.







GUITAR ENSEMBLE

Autumn Leaves – Joseph Kosma, Jacques Prévert and Johnny Mercer (arr. Des Miles)

'Autumn Leaves' was originally composed in 1945 as the French song, 'Les Feuilles mortes' ('The Dead Leaves') by Joseph Kosma. The original lyrics were written in French by Jacques Prévert and Johnny Mercer wrote the English lyrics in 1950. Since then, 'Autumn Leaves' has become a jazz standard and is thought to be one of the most recorded songs by jazz musicians.

Carol of the Bells – Mykola Leontovych (arr. Derek Hasted)
The melody of this popular Christmas carol is taken from a
Ukrainian folksong, 'Shchedryk', which translates as 'The Little
Swallow'. Before the Christmas lyrics were set by American
composer Peter Wilhousky, 'The Little Swallow' was originally
sung to celebrate the new year, arranged to tell the story of this
little bird by the Ukrainian composer, Mykola Leontovych in 1914.

Let it Snow! Let It Snow! – Jule Styne and Sammy Cahn (arr. Derek Hasted)

This popular Christmas song was actually written in July 1945 in California in the middle of a heatwave as a result of Styne and Cahn's wishful thinking of cooler weather! Although the lyrics of the song make no mention of Christmas, the song has come to be regarded as a Christmas song worldwide due to its winter theme.







BRASS ENSEMBLE

Bridge over Troubled Water by Simon & Garfunkel. A brass group arrangement of this popular song from the 70's with our second trumpet featured in parts of the arrangement. Some lovely counter melodies from the saxophones lead to a beautiful rendition of this song.

James Bond Medley featuring Gold Finger and Doctor No, the main themes from two of the early Sean Connery Bond films. Look out for the screaming trumpets alongside some very technical tongued playing.

FLUTE CHOIR

Cool Flutin' from Flute Fiesta by Colin Evans
We have enjoyed working on a few movements from this
collection of pieces in popular styles this term and chosen this
one to play this evening.

Little Donkey, trad, arr. Terry Cathrine This popular carol was written by British Songwriter Eric Boswell in 1959. The first version to chart was by Gracie Fields, followed a fortnight later by The Beverley Sisters.

Good King Wenceslas, trad, arr. Terry Cathrine
This carol tells a story of a tenth-century king of Bohemia who
goes on a journey to give alms to a peasant on the Feast of
Stephen. His page almost gives up due to the cold weather
but is encouraged to continue by following in the king's
footprints.

Silent Night by Franz Gruber (1818), arr. Terry Cathrine Gruber composed this carol to lyrics by Joseph Mohr in Oberndorf bei Salzburg, Austria. It was declared an 'intangible cultural heritage' by UNESCO in 2011.







SENIOR STRING ORCHESTRA

A selection of themes from the film series: Star Wars (Main Title), Cantina Band, The Imperial March, The Emperor arrives, Augie's Great Municipal Band, Across the Stars before returning to the main theme.

Havana

This is an arrangement of the well known song Havana written in 2017. It is a Salsa inspired mid tempo pop and latin song in which the American singer Camila Cabello embraces her Cuban heritage. The Brass and Woodwind take it in turns to have the main theme with a lovey Trumpet solo played in the middle.




Do you love the opportunities that the North Devon Music Centre gives your young person?
